These aspects will take a prominent place in our plans and we are eager and confident that we can nurture these skills in our children.

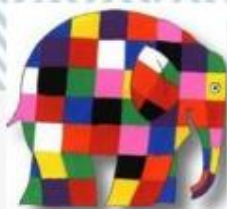

The Six Learning Areas:



Health and Wellbeing: The children's health and wellbeing will be at the heart of our plans this term. We will be giving attention to safety and hygiene as well as developing the children's confidence. During circle times we will be encouraging the children to express their feelings and emotions. Yoga, dance and playground games will be the content of our P. E. lessons and we look forward to teach the children the importance of relaxing as well as seeing their competitive side!

Language, Literacy and Communication: There is no better feeling than seeing the children learning the Welsh language and falling in love with its culture. We promote this through a variety of activities from singing to learning weekly Welsh phrases. We use phonic programmes such as 'Tric a Chlic' to develop the children's reading skills. Going into the children's imaginative world is very important to us

to stimulate them to write and we take every opportunity for the children to use different writing forms and working cross curricular in thematic work. We also teach the children to communicate through Makaton and we concentrate on a new sign weekly.



Mathematics and Numeracy: We will be concentrating on developing the children's recognition and understanding the value of numbers, sequencing numbers and adding and subtracting with the older children this term. We will be taking advantage of every opportunity for the children to work practically, cross-curricular and to learn through play; from counting and sorting in the house to building and measuring towers in the blocks.



Expressive Arts: As the saying goes; 'singing feeds the soul' and we will be singing seasonal and thematic songs, play musical games and will listen and respond to Carnival of the Animals. They will create sounds to accompany stories. We will perform thematic songs and prepare for Christmas, we will also learn how to keep a steady beat. We will imitate famous artists' work as well as experimenting creatively whilst doing arts and crafts.

Science and Technology: We will ignite the children's curiosity and nurture their ability to learn independently through a variety of exciting activities, investigations and experiments. We will be applying the digital competence framework through activities such as data collecting, coding, creating and editing and learning about online safety.

Humanities: We look forward to learn and appreciate the world around us. We will take advantage of every opportunity to learn in the outdoor area and we will be developing a range of skills cross-curricularly in the Forest School. We will be celebrating a variety of cultures and religions and concentrating on stories from the Bible.
